

Spellings will be sent home on a Thursday, in their home spelling book. Their spellings will relate to the phonics they have been learning that week.

Ways to extend and support

Once the children can spell the words, you can extend them by asking them to put it into a sentence.

Can they explode the sound- coming up with other words using their focus sounds.

Other ways to help at home:

Maths

How can you help at home?

Here are a few things that your child will be learning in Year 2. Practising these at home whenever there is a spare few minutes will really help them!

Time

Read the time on a clack to the nearest 15 minutes and then to the nearest 5 minutes.

Money

Recognise the value of a range of coins and notes and start to make amounts.

Times tables

Learn multiplication and division facts for the 2,5 and 10 times tables. Don't farget children can earn their times table badge if they know their 2,5 and 10 times table as well as the division facts!



Shape



Recognise some common 2D and 3D shapes e.g. triangle, square, circle, rectangle, cone, cuboid, pyramid, sphere.

Number bands

To know all number bonds to 10 and 20 e.g. 7+3=10, 17+3=20, 4+6=10, 14+16=20. 2's, 5's and 10's. Dan't forget children can earn their number band badges if they know all of their bands to 10,20 and 100 as well as the subtraction! E.g. 7+3=10, 10-3=7.

Grammar Term	What Does It Mean?				
noun	A naming word used to name a person, place or thing.				
noun phrase	A word or group of words in a phrase that acts like a noun e.g. Lilly wore a beautiful red dress. The groups of words, 'a beautiful red dress', is a phrase and functions as a noun in the sentence.				
verb	A verb is an action word; they describe what someone is doing e.g. Jessica shouted.				
adjective	An adjective is a word that describes a noun, e.g. there was a huge, hairy spider in the bathroom.				
adverb	An adverb tells you where, why or how much something is done e.g. Jessica shouted loudly.				
tense	A tense is the form of a verb that shows the time when an action takes place, e.g. past, present or future.				

Communication




- Should you wish to discuss anything with us we will be available after school or through emails or phone calls to the office.
