

PE

This term, Year 3 have PE on:

During days when children have PE sessions, they should arrive at school in their PE kits including trainers (this might change as the field becomes muddy later in the year). During colder weather, this should also include jogging bottoms and fleeces.



Fruit and water

Children are free to bring in a piece of fresh fruit to eat from home as a breaktime snack

Please can snacks be limited to one whole piece of fresh fruit or a pot of chopped up fruit. Unfortunately, we cannot allow other snacks including dried fruit or chocolate.



Children should bring in a water bottle that will be kept in the classroom and they will have access to it all day.

- Reading checking comprehension / helping children understand unfamiliar vocabulary (Reading Records)

Children have access to Bug Club and a reading book.

Children will be assessed on a regular basis to ensure they are on the correct book colour.

Please remember, at home you can read ANYTHING – books, comics, fact-files, poems, fiction and non-fiction....just enjoy reading together with your child.







Expectations


