Sports Premium Funding

As a school, we receive money from the government to promote sport in our school. This year we have decided to use some of the money to provide new experiences for our children and for them to have the opportunity to try a new sport that they may not have come across before.

So far this term all of our children have taken part in skipping workshop. All of our children in Year 6 have just taken part in a six-week martial arts programme run by Matt. This has proved very popular with the children to the extent that Matt has agreed to run evening martial arts lessons for children in our school on Wednesday evenings from the beginning of next year. Following this amazing achievement, both will now be going on to the nationals next May. We are thrilled with the children's achievements and wish them every success next year!

Year 5 Learn the Ukulele

As part of our ongoing enrichment programme, all of our children in Year 5 have been having ukulele lessons this term. This is a new initiative in our school and is proving to be a very popular one with the children. It is amazing to listen to the progress they are already making!

Information About What is Taught in Each Year Group

A number of parents have recently enquired where they can obtain further information regarding our curriculum at Bailey's Court and the subject areas that children will be learning this term. In order to support parents, we have published a number of documents on our school website in the Learning section which provides detailed information regarding the areas children will be learning about.

101 Things to Do Before ...

Today we relaunched our initiative, '101 Things to Do Before I Leave Bailey's Court'. Each year the children are set a range of challenges to complete at home throughout the year which are

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specific to their age and stage of development. Once completed, children are encouraged to complete their '101 Booklet' and bring it back to school so that they can be awarded with a special badge and certificate.

Details as to what is needed to complete the challenges can be found in the 'Learning' section of our school website. Children have until the summer to complete this year's initiative.

Brightwell

Last year we nominated The Brightwell Therapy Centre, which is based in Bradley Stoke, as the charity we would like to support. The children in each year worked hard on their enterprise projects and collectively raised a massive £1350. We presented the money in a special assembly and The Brightwell were extremely grateful and appreciative.

Birthday Fridays

Today we celebrated our first Birthday Friday of the school year. Instead of holding these at the end of each month as we did last year, we have now organised these to take place at the end of each term. All children in the school have spent this afternoon playing games to celebrate the birthdays of all of the children who have had birthdays during this term. This was an initiative we started during the Covid pandemic and due to popular demand, we have decided to continue with it.

Pupil Premium

Every year at this time, we send out a reminder to all families about **Pupil Premium** funding. **Pupil Premium funding** was introduced by the government in April 2011 and, since that date, schools have been allocated funding for children from families who are eligible for certain Government benefits, free school meals, plus looked-after children and those from families with parents in the Armed Forces. If a child has received free school meals at any point during their time at primary school, the school will continue to receive **Pupil Premium** funding until the day that they leave the school.

The aim of the funding is to help raise standards for children in these groups. For eligible children, we will be offering a whole range of benefits, including a 50% discount on these activities:

Residential school camp (Y6)

Educational school visits

Musical instrument lessons (in school)

On top of this, we will be offering a free set of school uniform (to be purchased through the school) and a free place at our Breakfast Club. We will also be providing an additional 50% contribution of up to £100 towards a club that is run either inside or outside of school. It would be a requirement that any club would promote the values of the school. This might include, for example, swimming lessons or beavers/cubs/brownies.

In addition to the list above, it is intended that this year's funding will make a contribution towards the following: (This is a small sample of what we offer, there are more details are available on the school's website.)

- -Interventions to support children's learning in small groups
- -Pastoral Support (with Mrs Martin)
- -Counselling
- -Resources for use in English and maths, including IT
- -Forest schools
- -Lunchtime support groups

You can register for Pupil Premium if you are in receipt of a number of Government benefits:

- -Income Support
- -Income-based Job Seekers Allowance
- -Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- -Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum act 1999
- -The Guarantee element of State Pension Credit Child Tax Credit (with no working credit) with an annual income of no more than £16,190
- -Working Tax Credit run-on
- -Universal Credit



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All children who are in Reception or Year 1 or Year 2 in a state funded school have been offered a free healthy school lunch. Children in other years will also be offered a free school lunch if their parent is currently receiving any of the welfare benefits listed above.

This additional pupil premium money is available from central government for every child whose parent is receiving one of the welfare benefits listed above. It is therefore important to sign up for free school meals, even if your child is in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2, so that your child's school receives as much funding as possible and we can help to provide you with the benefits listed above.

If you are in receipt of any of the Government benefits (listed above) or are already registered for pupil premium, please contact the school office and Mrs Canings will be happy to answer any questions you may have and will provide you with the necessary forms to complete.

Bicycles and Scooters

For health and safety reasons, we ask that no children or their parents ride bicycles or scooters on the school playground. If they need to be brought on to the school site they need to be pushed. We ask that this rule applies to very small children as well please.

Holiday and Absences from School Reminder

This is to remind parents that absence from school may only now be granted by the head teacher in 'exceptional' circumstances.

Governors have agreed that this could include, attending funerals or family weddings etc.

Following Government guidelines, holidays cannot be authorised during term time. The head teacher can only consider applications made using the 'School Application for Absence Form' which must be submitted two calendar weeks ahead of the date requested for absence.
