Anti-Bullying Week

Last week, alongside many schools across the country, we took part in 'Anti-Bullying Week'. The focus of the week was to help all of our children answer three particular questions:

- What is bullying?
- What bullying is not?
- What can you do to stop bullying?

The first two questions seem very obvious, but we often find there is confusion about the word bullying. We define it as follows:

Bullying is:

- When one child or a group of children, keeps on trying to upset or hurt another person
- Done on purpose, over and over again

Bullying is not:

- When you have an argument or fall out with someone, or when you say something unkind to someone once when you are angry. This is, of course unacceptable but it is not what we call bullying

To stop bullying:

- You must tell someone you trust
- Don't be a bystander – if you see bullying, tell someone!

The week comprised of a number of assemblies for both Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 about this, plus classroom activities to reinforce these messages. These activities have focused on a range of themes including the different types of bullying (including cyber bullying), how bullying can make people feel and why people might become bullies.

We have asked the children to tell someone if either they witness bullying or they feel they are being bullied. If you have a concern about this, please do approach your child's class teacher immediately: we would not want any child coming into school feeling unhappy or unsafe.

Information About What is Taught in Each Year Group

A number of parents have recently enquired where they can obtain further information regarding our curriculum at Bailey's Court and the subject areas that children will be learning this term. In order to support parents, we have published a number of documents on our school website in the Learning section which provides detailed information regarding the areas children will be learning about.

101 Things to Do Before ...

Each year the children are set a range of challenges to complete at home throughout the year which are specific to their age and stage of development. Once completed, children are encouraged to complete their '101 Booklet' and bring it back to school so that they can be awarded with a special badge and certificate.
